20 points of the Green Paper taken up in the Conclusions

- Developing a Europe's energy policy based on three main objectives: sustainability, competitiveness and security of supply
- Present a Strategic EU Energy Review on a regular basis to the Council
- Completion the internal electricity and gas markets
- Developing a **priority interconnection plan** and its contributions towards 10% target of interconnections as agreed by European Council in Barcelona in 2002
- Increasing diversification eg through the development of infrastructure.
- Clearly identified priorities for upgrading and construction of new infrastructure for security of energy supply and diversification
- Making the networks operate like a single European grid.
- Enhancing cooperation between regulators and system operators.
- Increasing transparency in the oil and gas markets.
- Promoting energy research funding.
- Developing a **Energy Efficiency Action Plan** bearing in mind the EU energy saving potential of 20% by 2020
- Developing a long-term Renewable Energy Road Map
- Promote to use a biomass, including an Action Plan, with a view to diversify energy sources, especially oil in transport.

- Renewed efforts to increase energy efficiency in transport sector and housing
- Reviewing the Emissions Trading Scheme
- Developing a common EU External energy policy
- Spreading the internal market to EU's neighbours through extension of a Energy Community Treaty (for South-East Europe)
- Developing a common operational approach to external crises.
- Develop new and improve existing energy dialogues with major producing and consuming countries
- Integrated framework for EU-Russia energy relations
