
We are a French Arabic family living in Denmark.


He seems to be very independent and clearly knows what he should do in order to create a future for himself and make the right choices for him and his environment.


I know his teachers, they keep me informed periodically about my sons progress and if I need to pay attention to anything.

The students have a very good relationship with each other, there is lots of group and project work, which integrates the students and teaches them tolerance of others and others ideas, also that there are other ways of learning things.


