In deliberations with the Dutch Government about the European proposal to extend the mandate of the European Monitoring Centre on Racism and Xenophobia (EUMC) to become a Human Rights Agency, the Dutch Senate has not been convinced of the necessity of this proposal and therefore sent a very clear message to the government to prevent the establishment of the Human Rights Agency. The Agency as proposed will unnecessarily double the activities of existing institutions and organisations, specifically the Council of Europe, the Organisation for Security and Cooperation in Europe and the European Court of Human Rights. The Agency will also make an undesired distinction between the EU 25 and the other 21 European countries.

At the end of the meeting on Tuesday November 15th the political parties of the Senate concluded that there is a very big risk that the whistle will be blown on the ministers if they continue the negotiations. The ministers asked the Senate for some negotiating space but since the ministers were very reluctant to make specific promises to the members of the Senate, the Senate did not change his point of view.
