Under the Swedish Presidency of the EU an ambitious framework for police, customs and law cooperation between Member States, rescue services, asylum, migration and visa policy has been set: **the Stockholm Programme**.

The implementation of this programme will raise several questions, notably about cross-country cooperation, data gathering and sharing and **the difficult balance between internal security and civil liberties**.
