Dear Mr. Schulz,

We the undersigned chairs of the competent Committees of national Parliaments of the European Union are writing you to express our concern for the way the European Parliament has transmitted its draft legislative proposal on the reform of the Electoral Act (EP-resolution T8-0395/2015, file number 2015/2035) to us.

You are aware, on 11 November 2015 the European Parliament adopted a resolution and a proposal for a Council decision, based on Article 223 TFEU, adopting the provisions amending the Act concerning the election of members of the European Parliament by direct universal suffrage (electoral act reform proposal). This proposal constitutes a draft legislative act as specified in Article 3 of Protocol 2 to the Lisbon Treaty. According to Article 2 of Protocol 1 and Article 4 of Protocol 2 to the Lisbon Treaty, draft legislative acts originating from the European Parliament shall be forwarded to national Parliaments directly. Then, within eight weeks of a draft legislative act being made available to national Parliaments in the official languages of the Union, any national Parliament or chamber has a right to issue a reasoned opinion concerning the subsidiarity of the proposal.

In this particular instance, national Parliaments were notified of the adoption of the draft legislative act by the EP not just much later than the Council, but also on different dates to each other, sometimes without the actual text of the proposal, and in some instances only via the IPEX system for the



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dissemination of documents. In fact some national Parliaments have still not received the transmission letter either by hard-or soft copy.

On this occasion, for whatever reason, the European Parliament failed to send the legislative proposal to the national Parliaments within the provisions of Protocol 1 and 2 of the Lisbon Treaty. As a result, national Parliaments were hampered in the exercise of their rights under the Treaty.

We, the national Parliaments are requesting you to provide us with an explanation for the failure of the European Parliament to transmit this proposal as a draft legislative act, in accordance with the provisions of Protocols 1 and 2. Furthermore, we ask you to take appropriate steps to ensure that this situation does not occur again.

We look forward to receiving a response to this letter and certainly before Tuesday, 16 February 2016.
