Dear Commissioner Avramopoulos,

By letter of 7 September 2016, the Danish Government informed the Commission that the current border control against Germany is deemed to be proportionate with regards to scope, frequency, location and time, and is limited to what is strictly necessary to respond to the serious threat and to safeguard public policy and internal security in Denmark. The Danish Government moreover informed the Commission that the Danish Government considers at this stage that there are no grounds for phasing out or scaling down the border controls against Germany.

By e-mail of 12 September 2016, the Commission has asked the Danish Government to provide the Commission with precise and monthly information and figures on the controls performed by Denmark following the Council Implementing Decision of 12 May 2016 setting out a Recommendation for temporary internal border control in exceptional circumstances putting the overall functioning of the Schengen area at risk and their outcome as regards

- the total number of persons checked since the beginning of the application of the Council Recommendation by Denmark (12 May 2016),
- the number per month of third-country nationals not meeting the entry conditions referred to in Article 6 of the Schengen Borders Code and who tried to enter Denmark,
- the number of refusals of entry that took place following the controls, and
- the total number of asylum applications received by the Danish authorities, specifying the numbers of those lodged at the internal borders where controls are carried out.

The Danish Government can inform the Commission that the total number of persons checked following the Council Implementing Decision of 12 May 2016 setting out a Recommendation for temporary internal border control in exceptional circumstances putting the overall functioning of the Schengen area at risk is 1,074,406 persons.

The numbers per month of third-country nationals not meeting the entry conditions referred to in Article 6 of the Schengen Borders Code and who tried to enter Denmark are as follows:
