He denies the charges, and his lawyer claims the case is politically motivated.</p> <p>According to the defense, Anton Chechin was arrested in violation of legal procedures, and no neutral or objective evidence has been presented against him.</p> <p>A medical evaluation revealed a cystic formation in Chechin's brain measuring 14/9/8 mm (with a fibrous component up to 5.5/6 mm). A prior scan conducted in May showed a size of 10/9 mm. The latest medical opinion recommends consultation with a neurosurgeon.</p>
